# **VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (VET) IN SCHOOLS QUALIFICATIONS REGISTER**

VERSION 4:1 AS AT 22 JULY 2016

## Introduction

*The Vocational education and training in schools qualifications register* provides school administrators/staff and registered training organisations with industry advice regarding the suitability of VET qualifications for secondary students.

This advice is provided to enable schools and RTOs to assist students to choose qualifications which are more likely to lead to successful outcomes including completing the qualifications and effectively transitioning into further training or employment.

This Register also provides industry advice on preferred pathways such as school-based apprenticeships, school-based traineeships, Department of Training and Workforce Development pre-apprenticeship in schools or School Curriculum and Standards Authority VET industry specific courses.

It should be noted that students undertaking a:

- SBA or SBT must have a registered training contract with an employer in a relevant workplace; and
- PAIS or VIS course must undertake mandatory work placement in a relevant workplace.

- The Register is updated on an annual basis to maintain its currency and incorporate training package revisions.

## Qualification code and name

The most current version of the qualification as at 22 July 2016 has been included in the Register. Students commencing a qualification should be enrolled in the most current version of the qualification. ## Delivery options

Qualifications can be delivered as:

### **IBT - Institutional based training**

An institutional based training pathway enables full time enrolled school students to commence a nationally recognised qualification without a formal employment arrangement. Students can undertake this training while also completing the Western Australian Certificate of Education.

### **PAIS - DTWD funded pre-apprenticeship in school**

Pre-apprenticeships in schools are Certificate II programs that have been nominated by Western Australian training councils as valid pathways from school to related apprenticeships. Students attend school, train at an RTO and are linked to an employer for work placement. The student must complete a work placement as nominated in the pre-apprenticeship program. The RTO will coordinate work placements in partnership with the schools.

### **SBA/SBT - School-based apprenticeship / school-based traineeship**

Apprenticeships and traineeships equip young people with employability skills and a nationally recognised qualification. School-based apprenticeships and traineeships are paid employment based training programs for full time school students 15 years of age and over. Under these arrangements the student is both a full time student and a part time employee with the same employment and training privileges and responsibilities as other apprentices/trainees.

To be a school-based apprentice/trainee a student must fulfil certain requirements, including:

- enter into a training contract with an employer to complete an apprenticeship/traineeship;
- have their school's agreement to undertake the school-based apprenticeship/traineeship; and
- have the completed units of competency of their apprenticeship/traineeship included on their WACE.

### **VIS - SCSA VET industry specific courses**

VET industry specific courses are for full time enrolled school students aiming to enter further training or the workforce straight from school. These courses include a full VET qualification, mandatory workplace learning and may contribute to the Certificate II requirement for WACE.

## Preferred delivery options

These are the industry preferred delivery option/s for secondary students.

## **Workplace assessment requirements**

Some training packages include requirements for students to undertake mandatory assessment in the workplace or in conditions that simulate a workplace; or recommend workplace assessment (refer to the training package for full assessment requirements).

The Register provides advice on the assessment requirements specified in training packages for the core units of competency:

- Workplace – assessment must be undertaken in the workplace.
- Workplace and/or simulated – assessment can be either undertaken in a workplace or simulated environment.
- Workplace recommended – assessment in the workplace is recommended.

Please note where a simulated environment is used for assessment it must reflect current workplace environments.
